

I Sergeant Jason Donjon DSN 42, have been employed with the Columbia Police Department for 4 years and 11 months. On 05/05/09 at about 0650 hours, I drove to 2854 Robert Drive in Columbia Illinois reference, check the welfare. The complainant, Christopher E. Coleman called the police department and told the dispatcher, Christopher called home but did not receive an answer. Due to recent threatening letters, Christopher received, he wanted the police to check on his wife and kids. On 01/02/09 Christopher reported received a threatening letter in his mailbox. The letter read, "[REDACTED]! Deny your God publically or else! No more opportunities. Time is running out for you and your family! Have a goodtime in India [REDACTED]!" On 04/27/09 Christopher reported receiving another anonymous letter which read, "[REDACTED]. I am giving you the last warning! You have not listened to me and you have not changed your ways. I have warned you to stop traveling and to stop carrying on with this fake religious life of stealing people's money. You think you are so special to do what you do protecting or think you are protecting her. She is a bitch and not worth you doing it. Stop today or else. I know your schedule! You can't hide from me ever. I'm always watching. I know when you leave in the morning and I know when you stay home. I saw you leave this morning. I will be watching. You better stop traveling and doing what you are doing. THIS IS MY LAST WARNING! YOUR WORST NIGHTMARE IS ABOUT TO HAPPEN!" He told the dispatcher, he was en-route home.

Christopher Coleman had previously indicated to the Columbia Police Department that he had installed multiple video cameras inside and outside his residence located at 2854 Robert Drive, Columbia, Illinois.

At about 0652 hours, I arrived on scene and met with Detective Sergeant Justin Barlow DSN 85, who stood on the front porch. Detective Sergeant Barlow told me, he rang the doorbell, but did not receive an answer. I walked to the rear of the residence and saw the basement rear window standing open. I saw the screen to the window leaning against a patio chair and laying on the grass. I notified dispatch and Detective Sergeant Barlow about the window. Detective Sergeant Barlow met with me at the rear of the residence. We notified Officer Steve Patton DSN 50 to come to the residence.

Detective Sergeant Barlow and I removed our department issued Glock .40 Caliber pistols from their holsters and entered the basement through the open window. I announced "Columbia Police!" several times but did not receive an answer. Detective Sergeant Barlow and I searched the basement but did not find anything out of the ordinary.

Detective Sergeant Barlow and I tactically went up the basement stairs to the first story of the house. I saw red spray paint sprayed all over the walls on the first story. I heard the garage door open. Detective Sergeant Barlow opened the interior garage/house door and yelled at Christopher to stay outside. Officer Patton entered the house and began searching along with Detective Sergeant Barlow and myself.

After searching the first story and finding no one, we tactically went up the stairs to the second story of the house. As I walked up the stairs, I looked to my left and saw a white

female, lying on her stomach on the bed. I saw her hair laid over her face. I saw she did not have any clothes on. I yelled, "Columbia Police!" and she did not move. I called for an ambulance. I searched the hallway and bedroom for anyone else but did not find anyone. I knelt down next to the white female and pulled her hair away from her face. I attempted to get a pulse from her neck but did not find one. I attempted to slightly roll her over in order to see her eyes and check for breathing. I noticed when I lifted her shoulder, her neck and head moved also. It appeared rigamortis has began to set in. I noticed the skin on her chest and head area appeared purple.

I heard Officer Patton tell the dispatcher, he needed 3 ambulances. Officer Patton yelled, "There are a total of three victims!" I walked into the rear upstairs bedroom and saw a young boy lying in the bed. I saw his face appeared purple. I checked for a pulse but found none. I walked to the front upstairs bedroom and saw a younger boy lying in his bed. I checked for a pulse on the younger boy but found none. I also noticed his face appeared slightly purple.

Detective Sergeant Barlow, Officer Patton and I completed a more completed search of the upstairs but did not find anyone.
